

City of Ripon

As a resident within the city limits of Ripon, you are responsible for the following services provide by the City.

Water: Most of the homes in Ripon are on a flat rate. The city supplies water generated from city wells.

Sewer: This fee is paid for sewer service and is used for the upkeep and maintenance of the wastewater treatment facility.

Garbage: There should be a garbage can at the residence from the previous occupant. If you moved into a newly constructed house, you must notify the city to get one delivered. Should you need a second can, you may request one for an additional fee, with a stipulation to retain the second can for one year or longer. You may also request a green can for brush only.



Important . . .

Do not put toxic waste into cans which are often labeled with warnings - CAUTION, TOXIC, DANGER, FLAMMABLE or POISONS, i.e., oil, paint, solvents, and pesticides. For more information, call 1-800-449-4840.

Cans should be placed with wheels against the curb at least 15 feet from any parked vehicle and five feet from each other. Lids must be closed for appropriate dumping. To assure proper service put can(s) out the night before your scheduled garbage day.

Utility Billing

The City of Ripon utility bill is sent monthly and due by the 11th of each month. In February you may pay annually and save 5%.

If your annual income is within the very low income level, you are eligible to receive a low income discount on water and garbage rates. For more information, contact City Hall at 599-2108.

Brush Service

During mid October through the first week in January the City of Ripon offers a Fall Brush Pick Up. Leaves and tree limbs will be picked up at no charge if out at curb sides. Tree limbs must not exceed four feet in length.

This program (VIPS) was created for the residents of Ripon and the Police Department. Volunteers, patrol strictly to be the eyes and ears for the department. Other duties may involve traffic control, security/vacation checks, dispatch, and working special events. A back ground check and extensive training is required. Dog licenses are valid through January 1 of each year and must be paid before March 1 to avoid a \$10.00 penalty. A current rabies certificate is required and if applicable, proof of neutering or spaying before license is issued. Dog license must be renewed each year. Fees are as follows:

\$5.00 if spayed/neutered
\$15.00 not spayed/neutered
\$10.00 penalty

Bicycle License

A bicycle license is required and is issued by the Ripon Police Department. Please bring your bike with you at the time of licensing. Cost is \$1.00 per year..
